
Male Reproductive System

Organs (1 of 2)

The organs of the male reproductive system include the *external* genitalia:

- the penis
- scrotum, within which are contained the testes and an initial section of the vas deferens


Organs (2 of 2)

Internally, the male pelvis includes:


- a major portion of the vas deferens
- the seminal vesicles
- the prostate gland

The penis and urethra are shared with the urinary system.

Male Reproductive Organs




Male Reproductive System Prostate Gland: Spelling








Suffix



Simple Prostatectomy Large Incision Surgery




Radical Prostatectomy (RP)



A 62-year-old male was found to have an elevated **prostate-specific antigen** (PROS-tāt) (spe-SIF-ik) (AN-ti-jen) test during a routine physical examination. At the age of 42 years he underwent a **vasectomy** (va-SEK-to-mē). The patient denies having nocturia or any significant change in his urinary stream. **Digital rectal examination** (DU-i-tal) (REK-tal) (eg-*zam*-i-NĀ-shun) revealed a mildly enlarged prostate gland with a 1.0 cm stony hard nodule of the right lobe. The urologist performed a **transrectal ultrasound** (trans-REK-tal) (UL-tra-sound) and biopsy. A diagnosis of adenocarcinoma of the prostate was made. The patient elected to undergo a **suprapubic prostatectomy** (*sū*-pra-PŪ-bik) (*pros*-ta-TEK-to-mē). Urinary incontinence complicated his postoperative course but this lasted for only 3 months. No **erectile dysfunction** (e-REK-tīl) (dis-FUNK-shun) was reported. His prognosis for full recovery should be excellent.
