

Thunder Clap Recognition

Above and Beyond Thunder Clap Students of the Week are voted on by the students in Above and Beyond, but we also include input from staff for this recognition. These students are placed on the Above and Beyond board in the commons and added to the website weekly. The student is highlighted with information on the activities he/she is involved in, their opinion on the importance of being a good role model, their reason for staying away from drugs, tobacco and alcohol, positive comments from peers and staff, and they get to publically recognize a hero from the community (hometown heroes).

Thunder Role's Posters

The students involved in the poster campaign are nominated by their peers as some of the best role models that Osseo-Fairchild has in athletics and clubs. These posters are photographed and designed by an OFHS alumnus and posted in the schools and community. We will continue this activity this year. In February, all high school students received a treat with individual personalized compliments of positive attributes or contributions that that student brings to our school written out by Above and Beyond Members. We will repeat this activity this year.

If you read them, you will see activities SPECIFIC to our district (i.e. the names of local parks, restaurants, school events etc.).
