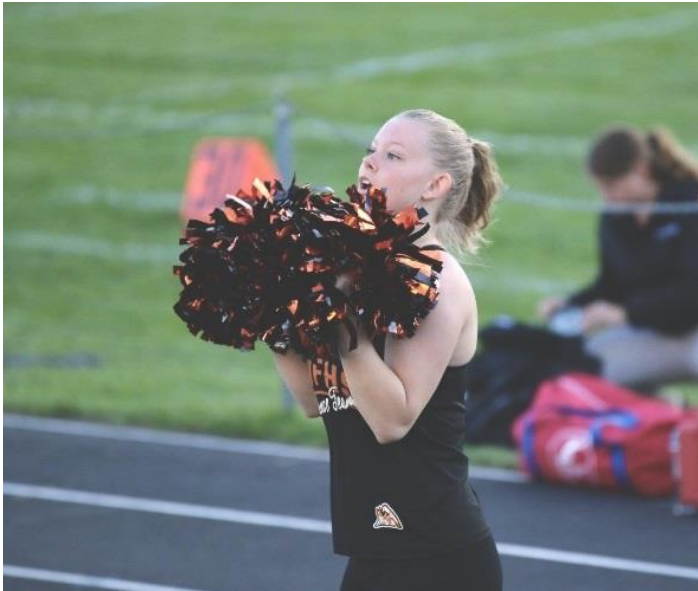


**The Above and Beyond 'Thunder Clap'**
